What is an “Open Society?”

An Open Society is a society based on the recognition that nobody has a monopoly on the truth, that different people have different views and interests, and that there is a need for institutions to protect the rights of all people to allow them to live together in peace. The term “open society” was popularized by the philosopher Karl Popper in his 1945 book Open Society and Its Enemies. Broadly speaking, an open society is characterized by a reliance on the rule of law, the existence of a democratically elected government, a diverse and vigorous civil society, and a respect for minorities and minority opinions.

About OSI

The Open Society Institute works to build vibrant and tolerant democracies whose governments are accountable to their citizens. To achieve its mission, OSI seeks to shape public policies that assure greater fairness in political, legal, and economic systems and safeguard fundamental rights. Program Description:

The Open Society Institute's Network Scholarship Programs (NSP) is pleased to offer supplementary grants to students from select countries of Eastern and Central Europe, the former Soviet Union, and Mongolia. The purpose of the program is to enable qualified students to pursue doctoral studies in the **Humanities and Social Sciences** at accredited universities in Europe.

GSGP will provide supplemental funding for one year of study. Recipients of GSGP grants will have the option to re-apply for an additional two awards after the first year of the original grant. Applicants seeking grant renewals must submit a new application for the year for which they are re-applying. The maximum number of years a recipient may hold a GSGP grant is three. Grantees applying for their second or third awards will compete with the general pool of applicants each year. A second or third grant is therefore not guaranteed.

Only students who have been accepted into a full-time doctoral (Ph.D.) program at an accredited university are eligible to apply.

Grants will be awarded on the basis of academic record, merit of the proposed study, applicant's long-term goals, and financial need.

Grants are provided to help cover costs in **only one** of the following 3 categories: *tuition and university fees; living expenses* (such as medical insurance, books, or other academic material); or *transportation costs* (travel to/from university, conferences, etc.) Grants will not be provided to cover expenses in all three categories. Only applicants with confirmed financial support will be considered for supplemental grants.

In no case may applicants request grant assistance for the support of:

1. *accompanying family members or partners;*
2. *national taxes;*
3. *computer hardware, software or other computer-related equipment;*
4. *automobile-related expenses of any type.*

For the academic year 2010-2011 grants will be awarded in amounts ranging from \$2,000 - \$7,000.

As part of the grant package, finalists of the program will be invited by NSP to attend an annual GSGP Spring conference within Europe in the Spring of 2011. Travel and accommodation costs from grantees' host universities to the conference site will be covered by OSI. Further details will be sent to grantees in late 2010.

Eligibility Criteria:

Applicants must review and comply with the following guidelines and complete the attached application form. **Members of the Roma community and other minority groups are highly encouraged to apply.**

1. All candidates must be nationals of one of the following countries:

- Applicants must be pursuing a **full-time** doctoral program in the **social sciences or humanities** at an accredited European university (excluding the Central European University in Hungary).
- Candidates must demonstrate proficiency in the spoken and written language of their host institution.
- Candidates who are alumni or current grantees of any OSI or NSP program must be in good standing with all grants (including submitting all relevant reports on time, etc.)
- ONLY** applicants who have already been awarded partial or full tuition, room and board stipends, or other types of financial support may apply.

Please note that if selected, grantees will be required to maintain full-time student status and abide by the terms and conditions outlined in a countersigned agreement between OSI and the grant recipient.

Ineligibility:

- These awards offer partial support towards full time doctoral studies in the *social sciences and humanities* only. Requests for support in the following fields will **not** be considered:
 - Business Administration/Management
 - Computer Science
 - Finance/Banking/Marketing
 - Engineering
 - Hard & Natural Sciences (Physics, Biology, Chemistry, etc.)
 - Mathematics
 - Medical Sciences
 - Fine or Performing Arts
- Applications for study in the student's home country or in Central and Eastern Europe¹, the former Soviet Union, or Mongolia will not be considered.
- Applications for non-doctoral study, part-time study, language preparation, and/or summer school courses will not be considered.
- Students with permanent resident status, dual citizenship, and/or asylum seekers in the country of the host academic institution or countries outside of the 20 listed in the previous page are not eligible to apply. Only those with valid student visas, or relevant student status, in the host country are eligible.

¹ Applicants studying at accredited institutions in Central or Eastern Europe that are within the European Union are eligible.

Documents Required Upon Application:

In addition to the signed application form, please send one copy of the documents listed below. Any **documents that are not in English should be accompanied by an official or university translation.**

1. Curriculum Vitae -- (should include education and work history, extra-curricular activities, academic awards, and publications);
2. Copy of official letter of admission from the academic institution;
3. Official undergraduate and graduate school transcripts (**new** applicants only);
4. Copy of an official letter outlining the details of your scholarship or financial aid award (if separate from item 2 above) and any other documents confirming additional financial support;
5. Copy of the identification pages of your passport;
6. Copy of your valid student visa for the 2010 - 2011 academic year;
7. Essays;
8. Two current academic reference letters (**new** applicants only) from professors who have direct knowledge of your work and abilities. Students already enrolled in a Ph.D. program must submit at least one letter from a professor in the department in which you are studying describing your academic progress over the past year. **Re-applicants** may submit one letter from their academic advisor describing their academic progress.

Omission of one or more of the documents mentioned above will render your application incomplete and may result in disqualification. In the event that a required document will become available only after you submit your application, please indicate this clearly in your application and send the document as soon as possible.

Selection:

Students are selected in an open competition announced once a year. A selection committee consisting of academic experts carefully review applications based on the quality of the application, written essays, academic records and progress, and future goals. Preference will be given to students who demonstrate a commitment to the academic and social development of their home community or region. Applicants should take into consideration their priorities as well as the three year funding limit when applying.

Decisions of the selection committee are final.
